

BYOD - Responsible Use Agreement

It is neither a requirement or a request for children to bring a device, merely an invitation.

Clearview has invested a great deal of money into providing our children with access to flexible technology and infrastructure in order to provide authentic learning opportunities. With the introduction of the BYOD programme, children without their own device will still have access to digital devices, primarily iPads and laptops on a group rotational basis.

Clearview has committed professional development for teachers to successfully utilise an Apple device in their programme and it is only the school's recommendation that should you choose to bring a device, it be an iPad, iPad Mini or iPod Touch.

Vision

Technology plays a large role in our students' lives. Personal devices can enhance and enrich learning opportunities both at home and at school. Clearview is committed to allowing responsible, learning-centered use of personal devices at school to provide as many pathways to learning as possible for our students.

This document represents a partnership of sharing and understanding between Clearview Primary, its students and their families and each party is subject to the rights and responsibilities outlined in the following document.

Access to the Clearview network is a privilege, not a right. Any use of the network entails personal responsibility and compliance with all school rules.

The Rights and Responsibilities of Clearview Primary

Clearview Primary is responsible for:

- Providing a strong and reliable computer network that is available to the school community for the purposes of teaching and learning
- Maintaining fast and reliable internet access to its staff and students
- Providing a safe and consistent Internet filtering process that aims to protect all users from misuse as long as the network is used for its intended purposes
- Providing through learning programmes the promotion of safe and appropriate use of electronic devices
- Maintaining the ability to monitor activity of users on the network which it will do randomly and periodically
- Maintaining a number devices for student and staff use at all times
- Providing areas in the school where the device can be safely stored under supervision

Clearview Primary has the right to:

- Randomly and periodically monitor activity of users on the network
- Inspect on a student's device their current school work, mindful that the students private content should remain private
- Remove a student's network access privileges

- Request a student to surrender their device to their teacher, team leader, assistant/deputy principal and/or principal to be returned to a parent/caregiver
- Expect students meet their responsibilities specified in this policy
- In cases of serious breaches of this policy by students, to permanently suspend the students use of a device and/or inform appropriate external agencies/authorities, including the New Zealand Police

- Discipline a student by:
 - ✦ Prohibiting the students from bringing a device to school
 - ✦ Suspending the students use of their device in class
 - ✦ Suspending the student's use on the Clearview network

The Rights and Responsibilities of Clearview Primary Teachers

The Teacher is responsible for:

- Working within the schools responsible use policy
- Ensuring that the teaching and learning provided in their homebase makes the best use of the available technology, including students accessing learning material and students submitting work
- Maintaining a high standard of behaviour in the class so that all students can access the Internet and use their devices safely and to the best educational advantage

The Teacher has the right to:

- Restrict the use of the device in their homebase when an alternative strategy is being used
- Require students to produce hand written work at any time
- Remove a student's access to the Clearview Primary network because a student has failed to meet their responsibilities in this agreement

The Rights and Responsibilities of a Clearview Primary Student/ākonga

The student is responsible for:

- The contents of their own device. If another person uses their device, the owner is responsible for ensuring it is used properly
- Taking care in looking after their device
- Ensuring their device is fully charged at the beginning of each day
- Keeping the passwords to Clearview's network and any other programs used that are secure and private
- Using the device in class for learning as directed by the teacher or in association with the topics and work assigned
- Not using their device or the network inappropriately

A Student will have the right to:

- Bring a mobile internet capable device to school
- Store private content on their device and that content will remain private
- Use their device before school, at breaks and after school in anyway they choose as long as it is in accordance with their responsibilities outlined in this policy

The Rights and Responsibilities of the parent/caregiver of Clearview Primary Student/ākonga

The parent or caregiver is responsible for:

- Endeavouring to provide their child with a device
- Discussing the contents and intent of this agreement with their child
- Remaining aware of what their child is doing with their device
- Ensuring their child understands the value of the device and respects it
- Insuring the device
- Notifying the school of any suspected misuse of the device in school time or on the school network
- Recording and storing the serial number of the device

The parent/caregiver has the right to:

- Expect that Clearview Primary will provide a strong, reliable and safe computer network that is open to all members of the school community for the purposes of teaching and learning
- Expect that Clearview Primary provides teaching and learning opportunities that make the best use of the device and available technology
- Ask to see work on the device that the student is currently undertaking
- Ask that the student not bring their device to school
- Query staff about work students are completing on the device

Examples of misusing your right to access the Clearview Primary computer network

- Access proxy sites that allow the user to bypass Clearview's internet security and controls
- Access, download, distribute or publish offensive material
- Be involved in electronic bullying e.g. obscene, offensive, disrespectful or aggressive language towards others
- Distribute or publish your own (or anyone else's) personal details over the Internet or between devices
- Distribute or publish your own (or anyone else's) login details
- Send email "Spam"
- Use another person's log-in details
- Breach copyright laws. Illegal downloading or sharing files that are copy written
- Download and/or install illegal software or software that you do not own or is not free
- Use a cell phone as a personal hotspot to bypass the need to use the Clearview network

You should also be aware that:

- While at school you are still subject to the schools Internet safety policy which you read and agreed to on enrolment. This applies to school and personal devices.
- You are responsible for the contents of your own device and any activity that is done under your log in details.
- If permission is granted to another person to use your device it is **YOUR** responsibility to ensure it is used properly. You will be held responsible.
- Failure to follow the guidelines, and to use your own common sense in judging what is right and what is wrong, will result in suspension of your right to use your device. Serious breaches of this policy will result in the permanent suspension of this right. Other consequences may also likely apply.

Security and Insurance

- The Device is your property and as such it is up to you to take due care of it given its expense

- The school will take no responsibility for loss or damage beyond a normal investigation into an incident involving student discipline
- The school is NOT insured for your device so insurance is your responsibility

School Liability Statement

- Students bring their devices to use at Clearview at their own risk. It is their duty to be responsible in the upkeep and protection of their devices

Clearview is in no way responsible for:

- Personal devices that are broken while at school or during school-based functions
- Personal devices that are lost or stolen at school or during school-based functions
- Maintenance or upkeep of any device (keeping it charged, installing updates or upgrades, fixing any software or hardware issues)

BYOD Agreement - initial, sign (overleaf) and return

Please review and sign the BYOD agreement together with your child. No student will be permitted to use personal technology devices unless the agreement is signed and returned.

Students and parents participating in BYOD must adhere to the BYOD Responsible Use Agreement, as well as all Board policies, particularly Internet Acceptable User Policy and Internet Safety Policy. Please read carefully and students need to initial every statement:

_____ Students take full responsibility for their devices. Personal devices cannot be left at school before or after the school hours.

_____ Devices cannot be used during assessments, unless otherwise directed by a teacher.

_____ Students must immediately comply with teachers' requests to shut down devices or close applications.

_____ Students are not permitted to transmit or post photographic images/videos of any person on public and/or social networking sites.

_____ Personal devices must be charged prior to bringing them to school and run off their own batteries while at school. Charging will be available on a limited basis and is up to teacher discretion.

_____ To ensure appropriate network filters, students will only use the BYOD wireless connection in school and will not attempt to bypass the network restrictions by using 3G or 4G network.

_____ Students understand that bringing devices on premises to infect the network with a virus or program designed to damage, alter, destroy, or gain access to unauthorized data or information is in violation of the school policy and will result in disciplinary action. The school has the right to collect and examine any device that is suspected of causing problems or is the source of an attack or virus.

_____ Clearview has the right to inspect content on any device irrespective of whether it has been the cause of a problem/attack/virus (This covers devices that may contain objectionable material obtained offsite and stored on the student owned device).

_____ It is the owners responsibility for the repair of any malfunctioning/damaged devices. Clearview does not supply technical services for student owned devices.

_____ Students should not physically share their personal devices with other students, unless they have written parent permission to do so.

_____ That the use of personal devices to support educational experience is not a necessity but a privilege. With respect of the rules, this privilege will benefit the learning environment as a whole. When rules are abused, privileges will be taken away.

_____ I understand and will abide by the above policy and guidelines. I further understand that any violation is unethical and may result in the loss of my technology privileges as well as other disciplinary action.

Parents:

_____ All devices brought to school are my son or daughter's responsibility and the insurance for the device is my responsibility.

I have read this document and understand the contents and will adhere to each part to maintain BYOD privileges.
